Grow Where Planted



“April showers bring May flowers,” as the old adage goes. Beautiful flowers blooming all around us. God’s creation is alive with color and new growth. This new growth comes from earlier growth. Trees, shrubs, bulbs all put forth their unique colors and fragrances each year. Dogwoods, Bartlett Pear, azaleas, tulips, irises, and many more. All blooming from their original plantings. They grew where planted. Whether that was in someone’s yard or garden, or from the by-product of some animal. My point is these seeds, grew and in many cases grew bountifully.

Seems the compost pile, which is made of yard and vegetable waste, trash as we see it, but to these couple of beets it was just what they needed. The result was baseball size beets. It just took some change for what was seen as waste to become part of God’s bounty.

What does that have to do with us, with me? I myself was born in New England, in my teens I migrated south to North Carolina. Before my move I had not accomplished much, at least as the world determines accomplished. For the next 21 years I continued to grow at least as what I saw as growing. Then came yet another change as I moved into South Carolina and this is where I have been planted for the past 23 years. Like most here in Landrum, I was transplanted not once but twice. I have grown where planted each time. Things, times, and places change but despite the changes around us we are to continue growing.

God allows a season of growth and then a season of rest. This rest precedes another season of growth. Like moving a plant from one spot to another, I believe God is moving me to another spot for me to continue my growth. But not just me, I believe Landrum UMC has been reseeded and being set for exponential growth beyond what many believe possible.

How many plant gardens and after all the work of tilling, hoeing, digging, planting, and feeding sit back and say, “All that work was a waste, and nothing will grow?” No one! When someone does all the work of planting it is for one thing growth. Together, let’s agree to believe God has everything under control and growth of His kingdom is about to take place. Let’s be determined to all grow where planted.


