How quickly we go from choruses of Merry Christmas to Happy New Year! But the Twelve Days of Christmas come after Christmas Day and they lead us to Epiphany, January 6th. There is a time when we need to take a long look at things past and it is true that we can learn from the mistakes and the good of our past.
