



Mark 6:7-9 New Revised Standard Version

7 He called the twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. 8 He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; 9 but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics.

Jesus called ordinary people to be his disciples and we too are called. We too are ordinary people! I am very happy to be joining you in ministry and to getting to know you and the community of Landrum. As a lifelong Methodist, I grew up in the small town of McCormick, SC, nurtured by McCormick UMC. The upstate has always been a favorite destination as I spent two summers working at Asbury Hills and now, I get to call it home!


